Charles W. Borgsdorf is a 1969 graduate of the University of Michigan Law School. He joined the firm in 1976 after practicing law in New York City and teaching law for 5 years. He continues decades of service on the board of the Michigan Advocacy Program which provides free legal services to the poverty community across 13 counties and runs 6 statewide programs which provide access to justice for poor people. He serves on 4 committees of the Michigan State Bar Foundation Access to Justice Campaign which raises significant funds for legal aid programs in the state. He has been recognized by The Federal Legal Services Corporation, the State Bar of Michigan and the Washtenaw County Bar Association for his work in increasing access to justice.”
